



State History and State Capacity in Russia and India

Source: Bockstette et al. (2002). Shown is the state history index with a discount rate 50.


Partial correlation of interpol crime rates (homicide, rape, theft, fraud) against state history

Share of Subnational Expenditures in Total Outlays of National and Subnational Governments without Extrabudgetary Funds, 1992-2006












State History and Surfaced Roads, 2010 (%)




State History and Paved Roads, 2010 (%)




State History and Slum Housing, 2010 (%)




State History and Homicide Rate, 2010 (Log)

Mechanisms

- Regional bargaining (Solnick 1995, Treisman 2000, Stoner-Weiss 2006)
- Norms of vertical compliance (Elias 1982, Foucault 1976, Scott 2004, Pinker 2011)
- Legitimacy of local elites (Martin 2001, Hirsh 2005)
- Sub-nationalist and regionalist movements (Herrera 2005, Singh 2011)

India

- Some surprising similarities to Russia:
- Until 1947, all of South Asia ruled as one single polity with its capital in Delhi
- After collapse of the British Empire, fragments into 8 new nation-states (Pakistan, India, Nepal, Sikkim, Sri Lanka, Afghanistan, Burma, and from 1971, Bangladesh)
- India is the core successor state to the old empire
- Contains very large number of 'autonomous regions' ('princely states')
- In first decade as a new state, undergoes comprehensive federal reforms ('states reorganisation')




Uttar Pradesh


