What's New?


- 45 countries
- Only Pew 2007 data
 - No WVS ☺
- New indicators of economic development
 - Structure of economy, fuel exports, growth, globalization
- Two approaches to measuring political development
 - Liberal democracy and quality of governance
- Indicators of sociocultural modernization
 - Urbanization, religiosity, gender equality

Two Forms of Anti-Americanism

Variable	1	2
Negative attitude to the U.S.	1.059	
Negative attitude to Americans	0.953	-0.244
Negative attitude to spread of American ideas and customs	0.596	0.293
The U.S. promotes democracy mostly where it serves its interests	-0.247	1.073
U.S. policies increase the gap between rich and poor countries	0.163	0.721
The U.S. does not take into account the interests of other countries in making international policy decisions	0.173	0.688

Correlation of factors is \approx .6

Puzzle: Anti-Americanism and HDI



GDP per capita vs. HDI

GDP per capita

- Straightforward measure, not an index
- Precondition to human development

HDI

- No log transformation needed
- Explains anti-Americanism better

Issue-Oriented AA

- Very good linear relationship with HDI or GDP per capita
- Correlation is .6 with Israel, .7 without
- No other significant predictors

• (?) People in rich societies think about international politics and are critical about the U.S. policies (?)

Conclusions

- Strong evidence for the two theories of general anti-Americanism:
 - Ressentiment: Least developed countries not "infected" yet, while most developed already "recovered"
 - Cultural gap: Muslim societies are very anti-American
- Issue-oriented anti-Americanism is widespread in the most developed societies
 - Interest in world politics as a good indicator of postmaterialist values?
