- 12 countries included in the analysis


Interpersonal Trust






2.1 General Trust(by Gender)


Males tend to be more trusting than Females...

Most people can be trusted




2.2 General Trust(by Age)

Very low Correlation, Gender is Significant only



- 6. Trust People of another Nationality


3. The question that were asked in the Survey

I 'd like to ask you how much you trust people from various groups. Could you tell me for each whether you trust people from this group completely, somewhat, not very much or not at all?


For the purpose of the analysis, The "Trust Completely" were taken only

3. The Results: Lebanon low, Egypt high




3. The Results by Gender:

- Male tend to trust their neighborhood more than Females (Tunisia and Morocco different)




3. The Results by Gender: high in Libya, Qatar and Yemen




3. The Results by Gender: high in Lebanon, low in Palestine..




3. The Results by Age: 55+ Trust more than the others, low in Lebanon and Palestine



4. Conclusion:

- Males tend to trust most people than Females.
- The Elderly tend to believe less in trusting most people.
- In general, Trust in most people is low compared to trust in family and neighborhoods
- Lebanon and Palestine has special situation when it comes to trust family and neighborhood
- Lebanese were the highest to trust people "they meet for the first time, different religion, different nationalities"
- Most people build up their General trust by having it from outsources and not from family, people they know and neighborhood
