## LATENT CURVE MODELS: A STRUCTURAL EQUATION PERSPECTIVE

Latent Curve Models (LCMs) are an increasingly popular approach to analyze longitudinal data. Though the models go by many names (e.g., growth curve modeling, latent growth models, latent trajectory models), they all refer to statistical models for longitudinal data that allow each individual in the sample to have distinct over-time trajectories of change. These patterns of change are summarized in relatively few parameters. The parameters in turn are modeled as functions of other variables.

## Additional course will be INTRODUCTION TO SEM AND SEM SOFTWARE.

Registration fees are 500 euros per person. We provide a restricted number of free of charge places (including travel expencies, accomodation, food and fees) on a competitive basis.

For application one should submit: (1) Curriculum Vitae; (2) a motivation letter (not more than 400 words); (3) abstract of the research project (not more than 1000 words); (4) description of the data one is going to use during the practical course (not exceeding 200 words).
