Thesis title: "Class identification in New Zealand: an analysis of the relationship between class position and subjective social location".

Supervisor: Dr. Bruce Curtis, Department of Sociology, University of Auckland. I drew on Marxist and Weberian scholarship to examine the relationship between "objective" class position and subjective class placement in New Zealand. Using data collected by two New Zealand surveys in 1999 and 2009, I explored the connection between the objective social class positions of individuals and their own subjective perceptions of these circumstances. The evidence produced through correlation and regression analyses suggests that class continues to generate subjectively salient identities, leading one to deduce that there are no grounds for stating that it is no longer a significant feature in society.
